# INTRODUCTION:

Journey in Jordan offers authentic luxury travel experiences in the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan, a country forming part of the Holy Land, sacred to the three great monotheistic religions: Christianity, Islam, and Judaism.

Jordan is a peaceful nation with a rich and distinctive history. It was part of the Roman Empire, a land of crusaders during the Middle Ages, and under Ottoman rule until the Great Arab Revolt in 1916. Lawrence of Arabia resided here during the First World War and took part in the liberation of Aqaba from the Turks. The Emirate of Transjordan became a British Protectorate until 1946, when the country gained full independence as the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan.

With a population of nearly twelve million, the majority religion is Sunni Islam. There is a vibrant and integrated Christian minority comprising 3% to 5% of the people, mainly Orthodox, though there are also Catholic and Protestant communities. Jordan is a safe country and Jordanians are proud of its prevailing internal harmony and of being a centre of regional security.

Jordan is a constitutional monarchy with a parliamentary system elected by universal suffrage, in which His Majesty King Abdullah II plays an important unifying role. There are seats in the Jordanian Parliament reserved for Christians and for women.

Bordering Saudi Arabia to the south, Syria to the north, and Palestine to the west, Jordan lies along the Dead Sea, and at the Port of Aqaba on the Red Sea. Over the past three thousand years, God showed Moses the Promised Land from Mount Nebo, Jesus was baptised at Bethany Beyond the Jordan, and both Romans and Turks left their marks. There is peace with the State of Israel. Times of conflict have passed. Today, Jordan welcomes more than five million visitors each year. It is a friendly and hospitable nation with high standards of education, medical care, and infrastructure.

Over the last half-century, Jordan has played a central role in the Middle East peace process. It enjoys good relations with its neighbours and the broader international community. The country also plays a key humanitarian role in the region, offering a haven and refuge for those displaced by war and conflict, particularly from Iraq, Palestine, and Syria. Amman, the capital, hosts numerous diplomatic missions and international organisations. It is a hub of diplomatic activity and home to many large embassies, most notably from Germany, the United Kingdom, and the United States. According to the US Embassy's LinkedIn page, "it is one of the fast growing missions and... is among the top seven largest in the world".

JiJ offers authentic adventures for discerning travellers in small groups of two to six. Our intrepid explorers are as diverse as Jordan itself, brought together for twelve or fourteen days by a shared desire to trace our human story in one of the world's most beautiful and complex regions.

Each JiJ group is led by our affable team, which includes a former English banker who has had a home in Jordan since 1999, a native Jordanian with ten years of military service for his country, and an English lawyer who has arranged pilgrim groups to Jordan, Italy, and the Holy Land for over twenty-five years.

Together, we journey immersed in Jordanian culture and its way of life. JiJ's itineraries are dynamic and tailored to guests' specific preferences, even as our Journey progresses. The emphasis is on delivering a luxurious personal travel experience, with a minimum of two nights' accommodation at each location to ensure comfort. The host to guest ratio is typically one to two.

All Journeys begin and end at Queen Alia International Airport. Guests are welcomed as soon as they arrive and assisted through passport control and baggage collection. Royal Jordanian airlines, the national flag carrier, operates daily flights from Frankfurt, London, New York, Paris, and other cities, with the schedule available at [www.rj.com](http://www.rj.com). Other airlines flying directly to Amman include British Airways, Emirates, Air France, Lufthansa, Ryanair, and Turkish Airlines.

The JiJ team looks forward to welcoming guests to Jordan.



## THE GRAND JOURNEY (13 NIGHTS AND 14 DAYS)

### Day One: Arrival in Amman

Guests arrive at Queen Alia International Airport, Amman. Tikram VIP Services meets each guest at the aircraft or at the end of the air-bridge, and assists with passport control, baggage collection, and customs. After customs, the JiJ Team greets guests before the forty-minute car transfer to the Four Seasons Hotel on the 5th Circle, Amman, where guests check in for three nights.

There are no fixed plans for the remainder of the day. Many guests choose to relax and enjoy the hotel's luxurious facilities, including its excellent spa. A rejuvenating massage is included and scheduled upon confirmation of participation in the Journey.

For those arriving earlier in the day and feeling energetic, there is a visit to the King Abdullah I Mosque and the King Hussein Mosque, leaving the Four Seasons Hotel at 12:30pm.

JiJ hosts drinks and dinner at La Capitale Restaurant at the Four Seasons Hotel. Drinks begin at 6:45pm, followed by dinner at 7:30pm  
- an introduction to fine Jordanian wine.

### Day Two: Exploring Amman's treasures

9:30am: Depart the Four Seasons Hotel.

Our day begins with a visit to the Roman Amphitheater in the centre of the old town. Built in the 2nd Century when Amman was known as Philadelphia, the theatre is one of the largest of its kind, with a capacity of 6,000 spectators. A small museum inside highlights Bedouin life and Jordanian history. Today, the Roman Amphitheatre is used primarily for concerts. (Guided tour)

We then proceed to the nearby Amman Citadel, a site dating to 1500 BC and continuously inhabited until the early 20th Century. (Guided tour)

A light collation will be served at the Citadel, prepared and served by the Four Seasons Hotel.

We continue to the Royal Tank Museum, widely regarded as one of the finest military museums in the world, documenting Jordan's armed forces over the past century. We return to the hotel at around 5pm.

6:30pm: Depart the hotel for a private dinner catered by the Four Seasons Hotel at the Royal Automobile Museum.

## Day Three: Medieval castle and Roman city

Breakfast at leisure in the hotel. 9am: Depart the Four Seasons Hotel.

We travel approximately ninety-minutes to the northern city of Ajloun to explore its splendid 12th Century castle, originally built to repel crusaders and restrict the power of the Latin Empire by securing the key routes between Damascus and Egypt. (Guided tour)

Following the castle visit, guests may take a ride on the new cable car nearby, which offers spectacular panoramic views of the Ajloun region.

Following a light luncheon at Al-Wakhal Ghazal, prepared by the Four Seasons Hotel, we make our way to Jerash, the Greco-Roman settlement of Gerasa and inhabited since the Bronze Age. While Jerash was destroyed by King Baldwin of Jerusalem in 1121, it remains well-preserved and is often referred to as the Pompei of the Middle East. (Guided tour)

We return to the Four Seasons Hotel in the late afternoon.

7pm: We enjoy a delectable Levantine dinner at Fakhreldin Restaurant, an iconic local haunt, accompanied by local wine and beers. We return to the hotel depending on the mood of the evening.





## Day Four: Mount Nebo and the Dead Sea

Breakfast at leisure in the hotel.

We depart the Four Seasons Hotel to spend the next two nights at the Kempinski Hotel, Dead Sea.

9am: Depart the Four Seasons Hotel.

Approximately an hour away, we visit Mount Nebo, standing at 2,300 feet (700 metres) above sea level. According to Biblical tradition, it is here that Moses saw the Promised Land. Mount Nebo offers stunning views over the Dead Sea and across to Palestine. There is an active Catholic church, administered by Franciscan Friars and declared a minor basilica by Pope Saint John Paul II after his pilgrimage to Jordan in 2000. There is also an archaeological museum. (Guided tour).

We then make our way to Madaba, one of Jordan's most significant Christian towns, where we will enjoy a light luncheon at Carob House. Our visit includes the newly restored Orthodox church of St. George, which houses the renowned 6th Century mosaic map of the Holy Land. We also see Catholic churches, one dedicated to the Virgin Mary and the other to the Beheading of St. John the Baptist. (Guided tour) In the late afternoon, we travel to the Dead Sea, the lowest point on earth (431 metres below sea level), arriving around 6pm. We check in at the Kempinski Hotel for two nights.

The evening is at leisure, with a buffet dinner served in the hotel's main restaurant.


## Day Five: Dead Sea rejuvenation feeling on top of the world

This is a full day of leisure at the Dead Sea.

Buffet breakfast and buffet dinner served in the hotel's main restaurant. There is also an Italian restaurant at the hotel. Should the restaurant be open, guests are welcome to dine there instead if they prefer. JiJ is on hand to assist guests throughout the day.

At a mutually agreed time during the day, there is an optional two- and-a-half-hour excursion to the natural hot springs and waterfalls of Ma'en. Basic changing facilities are available on-site for guests wishing to bathe in the water.

There is an excellent spa at the Kempinski Hotel. At the time of booking the Journey, guests are able to select treatments from the spa menu link.



## Day Six: Spiritual reflections and a crusader castle

Breakfast at leisure in the hotel.

9am: Depart from the Kempinski Hotel.

We move from the Dead Sea to Petra, staying the next two nights at Hayat Zaman Hotel & Resort. During our stay, the Four Seasons Hotel provides the catering.

We begin with a short thirty-minute drive to the Baptismal Site of Jesus Christ. (Guided tour)

We also visit the adjacent Catholic church of The Baptism of the Lord, inaugurated in January 2025 by Cardinal Pietro Parolin, the Vatican Secretary of State, and Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzaballa, the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem.

We then travel to Petra. Guests have the option of going by road directly to Petra, or flying by helicopter with a stop at Kerak Castle, the largest crusader fortress in the Levant. Construction began in 1142 to protect the assets of Christian crusaders and the Latin States of Jerusalem.

By mid-afternoon, we arrive in Petra, where a light collation awaits. The evening is at leisure, with dinner served in the hotel's restaurant.

## Day Seven: Wonders of Petra

Breakfast from 6am in the hotel. Please be ready to depart by 8am. We recommend a hearty breakfast, as the day will be long and active. 8am: Depart the Hayat Zaman Hotel & Resort.

Today we enjoy a full-day guided visit to Petra. We begin the 8.5 km round trip along the Main Trail by electric buggy from the Visitors' Centre to the iconic Treasury. From there, we proceed on foot before returning by buggy. (Guided tour)

The Four Seasons Hotel will provide goodie bags containing refreshments during our visit.

Typically guests spend between three and five hours exploring Petra, depending on individual interest and stamina. Along the way, local Bedouins tempt visitors with camel and donkey rides to explore less accessible parts of the site.

7pm: Dinner in the hotel's restaurant.

## Days Eight and Nine:

### In the desert

Breakfast is available from 6am in the hotel. Please be ready to depart at 8am. Once again, we recommend a hearty breakfast, as only light snacks will be available during the day.

9am: Depart from the Hayat Zaman Hotel & Resort.

We travel approximately ninety minutes by road from our hotel to Wadi Rum. On arrival, we board 4x4 vehicles to take us deep into the desert to Hayat Rum Camp, our base for the next two nights. Light collation on arrival and again on Day Nine.

JiJ will curate each guest's desert itinerary according to personal preferences and energy levels. This magnificent desert offers guests the opportunity to visit, and even climb, many natural landmarks including Burdah Rock Bridge, the narrow canyon of Khazali Siq, and Jordan's highest mountain, Jabal Umm Ad Dami.

Guests may also visit the remains of the house of T.E Lawrence (1888-1935), better known as "Lawrence of Arabia". Stargazing and hot air ballooning are optional activities and may be booked in advance. (Various guided tours)

Dinner both evenings at Hayat Rum, followed by traditional Arabic desserts beneath the night sky with a campfire in cooler months.





## Day Ten: Arrival in Aqaba

Breakfast at leisure in the hotel. 9:30am: Depart from Hayat Rum Camp.

We leave Hayat Rum Camp for a ninety-minute drive to Aqaba, staying the next two nights at either the Al Manara Hotel or the Kempinski Hotel.

Early check-in at the hotel, with the remainder of the day at leisure in the city of Aqaba or at the hotel.

For guests staying at the Kempinski Hotel on Days Ten and Eleven, a variety of complimentary water-based activities are included in the Journey, such as scuba diving (subject to prior experience, though an introductory PADI diving course is available), snorkelling, jet or water skiing, paragliding, and power boating. All activities must be booked with JiJ prior to the start of the Journey. A massage is also included and should likewise be pre-booked.

6:45pm: Depart for dinner at the Royal Yacht Club, located just a few minutes' stroll from the hotel.

## Day Eleven: At leisure in Aqaba

A full day at leisure in Aqaba. Breakfast in the hotel's restaurant.

JiJ is available throughout the day to assist guests as needed. The JiJ Team are regulars at the Royal Yacht Club and frequent it for dinner. Guests are welcome to join or to dine at their hotel if preferred.

There are excellent spas at both hotels and a treatment of your choice is included in the Journey:

Guests should book treatments in advance through JiJ.

## Day Twelve: Return to Amman

Breakfast at leisure in the hotel.

10am: Depart from the Al Manara Hotel or the Kempinski Hotel. We depart from Aqaba and travel to Amman. Guests have the option of making the journey by road (approximately four hours) or by helicopter (around two hours).

For those remaining in Amman, an overnight stay at the Four Seasons Hotel is included. JiJ hosts a relaxed, informal dinner either at La Capitale Restaurant at the Four Seasons Hotel or at Dara Dining, depending on guests' preferences.

Light collation in the hotel lounge ordered from the menu.

Some guests may choose to depart from King Hussein International Airport in Aqaba. Flights typically leave around 8:30am or 4pm and connect through Queen Alia International Airport.



### Day Thirteen (Optional): Tailored programme

Breakfast at leisure in the hotel.

We bespoke this day’s activities to individual guest preferences. Some guests prefer to reduce the morning trip or to use the afternoon for shopping or relaxation.

We can make a moderately early start to visit the church of The Assumption in Salt, followed by a visit to the Haddad Jordan River Winery in Mafraq. Guests who have enjoyed Jordanian wines during our Journey will find this as an opportunity to savour another of Jordan’s hidden gems. (Guided tour)

A light collation in the hotel lounge.

Time permitting, in the afternoon, we visit the Museum of Parliamentary Life in Amman’s former parliament building, located between the 2nd and 3rd Circles. Our drivers are also on hand to assist guests with any last minute shopping.

JiJ hosts dinner at the commended Alee Restaurant on the 1st Circle in Amman, known for its award-winning cuisine and spectacular views.

### Day Fourteen: Farewell to Jordan

Breakfast in the hotel, with departures according to each guest’s schedule.

The JiJ Team will accompany guests to Queen Alia International Airport, where Tikram VIP services will assist with departure procedures.

Should guests wish to extend their stay, JiJ can arrange additional nights at the Four Seasons Hotel in Amman.

# GEOGRAPHY AND CLIMATE

All temperatures are in Centigrade




## Amman

Altitudes in Amman range from 700 to 1,200 metres and the air is generally dry. December, January, and February are the coolest and wettest months, and although rare, snow can occur. Average daily temperatures range from 8°C in mid-winter to 27°C in mid-summer. There is little precipitation between June and September. Evenings, except at the height of summer, can be cool and it is advisable to wear a sweater. The record high temperature in Amman is 44°C, and the record low is -8°C.



## Dead Sea

At 431 metres below sea level, the Dead Sea is the lowest point on earth. Although just an hour's drive from Amman, the climate differs significantly. The road descending from Amman to the Dead Sea is noticeably steep. Average daily temperatures range from 17°C in mid-winter to 34°C in mid-summer. Rain is virtually absent from May through September. The record high temperature is 47°C, and the record low is 6°C.




## Petra

Situated over 800 metres above sea level, Petra experiences average daily temperatures ranging from 5°C in mid-winter to 30°C in mid-summer. December, through March are the wettest months. Rainfall is minimal from May to October.




## Wadi Rum

Known also as the Valley of the Moon, Wadi Rum is a vast desert carved into sandstone and granite in southern Jordan, near the Saudi border. It is the country's largest river valley and was inhabited by several ancient civilisations, with Bedouins still residing there today. On average, summer daytime temperatures exceed 33°C, while winter nights can drop to freezing.



## Aqaba

Aqaba is a Red Sea port and resort town. Average daily temperatures range from 15°C in mid-winter to 33°C in mid-summer, with peaks reaching over 40°C.



## **UNESCO World Heritage Sites**

The Journey incorporates six of Jordan's seven UNESCO World Heritage Sites: Jerash, the Baptism Site (Bethany Beyond the Jordan), Madaba, Kerak, Petra, and Wadi Rum.

## HOW TO BOOK

JiJ offers each of its guests a bespoke, personal travel experience. We take time to get to know our guests, to understand and fulfil their expectations of the Journey, and to accommodate any special requirements - from the time of booking to the moment we bid farewell.

Prospective guests are asked to email us with their preferred dates, along with a telephone number and contact details. JiJ will respond by email or telephone, according to guest preference. Once guests confirm they are ready to proceed, JiJ will issue an invoice for payment.

A copy of the passport of each person travelling is required at the time of booking.

JiJ does not accept bookings from persons under the age of 18, although JiJ does welcome persons over the age of 14 and above if accompanied by a parent or guardian. There is no upper age limit, though we ask that any guest with a serious ongoing medical condition informs us at the time of booking and confirms that travel is not contrary to medical advice.

Medical services in Jordan are outstanding. However, each guest must have comprehensive travel and health insurance. JiJ requires the details of each guest's travel and health insurance policy or policies before the Journey begins. This is to enable JiJ to assist effectively in the event of an emergency. JiJ is unable to accept guests without full insurance cover for the whole of the Journey.

Please note that all communication with JiJ is in the English language. English is widely spoken in Jordan. English is the language used for all guided tours.

## ATTIRE AND CLOTHING

Dress throughout the Journey is casual. For men, jackets and ties are not required at any time. For women, trousers or dresses are suitable. Shorts and/or sleeveless attire are prohibited in religious buildings, though covering shawls may sometimes be available on site.

Clothing should be discreet on beaches and at swimming pools. Men should avoid skimpy trunks. Women may not bathe topless. Swimming shorts are the norm for men. Modest bikinis or swimsuits are acceptable for women. There is no requirement for women to wear Islamic dress at any time.

Amman evenings can be cool outside the summer months (late May to early September), so it is advisable to bring a light sweater. During the winter months (November to February), it is essential to wear a sweater and a coat.

JiJ strongly recommends that guests carry at least one change of clothing in their hand luggage in case of baggage delays or loss when traveling to Amman.

## GUIDED TOURS AND TRANSPORT

JiJ uses only qualified and officially licensed Jordanian guides to lead all guided tours of historic sites.

The Four Seasons Hotel, Amman, provides luxury limousines, luxury minibuses, and helicopter transfers. Limousines (and minibuses where applicable) remain at our disposal throughout the Journey.

# COSTS

The cost of the Journey is USD 45,000 per adult sharing a room for thirteen nights, and USD 40,000 per adult for those who choose to

depart on Day Twelve from Amman (i.e. eleven nights). A courtesy reduction of 10% applies to persons over the age of 14 but under the age of 18 at the time of travel.

Maximum six persons per journey. Maximum two persons per room. Minimum age 14 years.

JiJ has negotiated preferential rates for single travellers. The single supplement is USD 10,000 for the Journey, irrespective of duration, and includes sole occupancy of hotel rooms.

Rooms typically feature king-sized or double beds. Twin rooms are not always available as an option, though JiJ will do its best to accommodate specific requests.

The cost of a private Journey booked by one travelling party (three rooms, not exceeding six guests) is USD 250,000, subject to availability. No reductions apply to travellers under 18 years of age. JiJ will issue a single invoice for the full amount and JiJ cannot accept part payments.

To confirm your booking, a deposit of USD 2,000 is required payable online by Visa or Mastercard. If an increased deposit is required an invoice will be sent. The difference between the deposit and the Journey cost will be invoiced for payment by international bank transfer. International bank transfers are to one of JiJ's bank accounts in Jordan as specified in writing. Balances are due 75 days before the commencement of the Journey. Full payment is required within five working days if the Journey is booked 75 or fewer days before its commencement.

For private Journeys booked by one travelling party, the deposit is USD 60,000 and will be invoiced for payment within five working days by international bank transfer. If the booking is made 75 or fewer days before the Journey commences the total cost of USD 250,000 is payable within five working days by international bank transfer, also to one of JiJ's bank accounts in Jordan as specified in writing.

By arrangement, JiJ can issue invoices in EUR, GBP, and JOD. Payments must be made in the currency stated on the invoice. The Journey is fully inclusive as described. Where helicopter travel is offered as an option, it is included in the price.

## What is Included and what is Not Included

### Included

1. The services of Tikram VIP Services on arrival and departure at Queen Alia International Airport to facilitate a swift passage through the airport including fast track through passport control and assistance with luggage. Please note: these services are not available at Aqaba Airport.
2. Transport to and from the airport on arrival and departure.
3. Accommodation in a suite with a separate bedroom and sitting room, except in Petra and Wadi Rum where standard accommodation is provided - always with en-suite facilities. Accommodation is based on two persons sharing a room.
4. Meals and beverages as stated. Guests may choose freely from restaurant menus, which are typically à la carte except where there is a buffet. Local beers and Jordanian wines are available to accompany meals. We regularly raid the Four Seasons' wine cellar for fine wines, some of which we procure specifically for our Journeys. JiJ aims to be a gracious host and offers guests a selection of drinks as the occasion arises.
5. Admission charges for all scheduled sites. JiJ will arrange a Jordan Pass for each guest to facilitate entry.
6. All activities as specified in the itinerary.
7. Travel within Jordan as stated, normally using Mercedes S-Class cars or a luxury Mercedes minibus. Other premium transport may also be used.
8. The services of the JiJ Team, with two or three members accompanying guests throughout the Journey.
9. Tips for guides during all guided tours.

### Not Included

1. Air travel to and from Queen Alia International Airport, Amman.
2. Jordan entry visa. Though many nationalities can obtain a visa on arrival, we strongly recommend securing one online in advance via the Jordanian government website. JiJ requests a copy of each guest's entry visa prior to travel. Some nationalities require an embassy-issued visa prior to travel.
3. Any exit fees from Jordan (currently none).
4. Travel and health insurance.
5. Food and beverages not otherwise specified, and any hotel services such as laundry or dry-cleaning.
6. On Day Five, any account at the Italian restaurant in the Kempinski Hotel, Dead Sea, exceeding JOD 350 per guest (approximately USD 490).
7. On Day Ten, for guests choosing to dine at the hotel, any account in one of the hotel's restaurants exceeding JOD 350 per head (approximately USD 490).
8. On Days Ten to Twelve, any activities at the Kempinski Hotel, Aqaba, exceeding JOD 500 per guest (approximately USD 695).
9. On Day Twelve, airplane flights from King Hussein International Airport, Aqaba, to Queen Alia International Airport, Amman.
10. On Day Twelve, any light collation in the Four Seasons Hotel lounge exceeding JOD 150 per guest (approximately USD 210).
11. Cash gratuities to hotel staff or other service providers at guests' discretion.

## Notes

1. Journeys are strictly non-smoking and this includes the use of vapes.
2. If JiJ introduces guests to any retailers, souvenir shops, or other third parties during the Journey, JiJ does not have any specially negotiated prices and does not receive any commissions or “kick-backs”.
3. If a guest plans to travel by helicopter, take a hot air balloon, or participate in water sports during the Journey, it is essential to check that personal insurance covers these activities in the unlikely event of injury or death. Such insurance is the responsibility of each guest and not JiJ.
4. Travel by helicopter is subject to strictly enforced weight limits. If a guest opts for helicopter travel, JiJ will request their approximate clothed weight in kilograms at the time of booking. In the interest of safety, the helicopter captain may require guests to verify their weights on site using scales. Luggage - except for small handheld items - will be transported separately by road.
5. 4x4 vehicles used for travel in Wadi Rum are pick-up trucks. Interior passenger seating is available, though guests may choose to ride in the open. If riding outside, full covering is essential to avoid sun exposure, even during winter months.
6. Where there are itinerary options, JiJ asks guests to confirm their preferences at the time of booking.
7. Fakhreldin and Alee in Amman are cited among the fifty best restaurants in the Middle East.
8. At the time of booking, JiJ will enquire about any specific dietary requirements. JiJ can cater for most dietary requirements (e.g. vegan or vegetarian). Food in Jordan is generally prepared according to Islamic Halal standards. It is a legal requirement to disclose if food contains alcohol or pork.
9. Guests travelling in Crown Class with Royal Jordanian will use the dedicated Crown Class check-in at departure, rather than Tikram VIP Services.
